
2023 College Tuition

Caroline Chisholm Catholic College is committed to providing an af ordable fee structure to ensure that families wishing to access a high-quality, Catholic Education are able to do so. Fees at Caroline Chisholm Catholic College are comprised of three components:

(1) Tuition Fees (2) Laptop and Technology Levy and (3) Core Subject Digital Texts.



Laptop and Technology Levy: Includes a notebook given in Year 7 and Year 10, IT infrastructure and downloads, initial Compass ID card, initial complimentary student printing, annual yearbook and other College publications. Ownership of laptops are transferred to families where enrolment is maintained for the duration of the three years and all fees are paid.

Payment Options: Fees can be paid weekly (52 instalments), fortnightly (26 instalments), monthly (12 instalments) or per term (4 instalments).

The College may accept alternative payment arrangements under special and approved circumstances. Such arrangements would need to be made with the Business Manager.

A 5% discount will apply to fees paid in full by the second instalment. (Applies to Tuition Fee only and excludes levies and family discount).

Payment Methods: The College accepts BPay, cash, cheques, credit cards (Visa and MasterCard only), direct debits and Centrepay authorities.

Fr Karmel Borg Scholarship Fund: Families are encouraged to support the Fr Karmel Borg Scholarship Fund with voluntary contributions. This fund is used to cover the tuition fees of academic scholarship recipients of the College, instrumental music fees of deserving students, the annual awards given to students who excel in their studies, and occasionally to students to help allay costs for international sporting competitions.

A suggested amount of \$250 will appear on statements. All donations are tax deductible.

Additional Charges: Extra-curricular activities that are available and not covered by the College include interstate and overseas study tours, VET / VCAL courses and instrumental music programs, replacement Compass ID cards. These programs are only available to students where tuition fees have been paid or being settled in accordance with an approved payment option.

Notebook Claims: These are imposed by the College to cover repairs to notebooks and minimise disruption to a student's learning.

Re-enrolment: Families will be asked to confrm re-enrolment through Compass for the following year and complete subject selections in Term Three.

Overdue Accounts: Families are reminded that fees are payable in accordance with our payment terms. Overdue accounts will be followed up by our accounts department and may ultimately be transferred to a collection agency unless an alternate payment arrangement is confrmed with the College. Where a family does not currently have students at the College and fees remain outstanding, responsible parties will be required to enter into a direct debit agreement with the College. Payments must be made a least monthly, over a period of time as agreed with the College's Accounts department.
